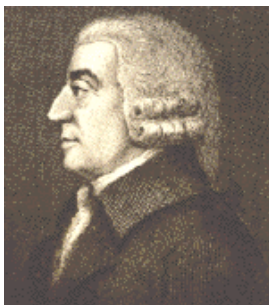

THE ONLINE LIBRARY OF LIBERTY

- Is a multi-award winning site which makes available at no charge to the public outstanding resources for teaching & learning about the humanities & social sciences.
- Is divided into 2 sections: *The Forum* for educational aids; & *The Library* where the books are stored.

THE FORUM

- Has over 800 essays & study aids: biographies, timelines, introductory essays, key documents, & detailed bibliographical essays on key thinkers & topics.
- A collection of hundreds of Quotations about Liberty and Power.

THE LIBRARY

- Contains over 1,200 classic books about liberty by over 400 authors.
- The texts span 4,000 years of human history & cover the disciplines of economics, history, law, literature, philosophy, political theory, religion, sociology, & war & peace.
- Books are available in 3 different formats: facsimile PDF, HTML, and PDF E-Books.
- Authors have a brief bio & are organized into groups; books have a brief description & are organized into collections.
- Detailed bibliographical, copyright, & fair use information is provided about each book.

DOWNLOADABLE MARC RECORDS

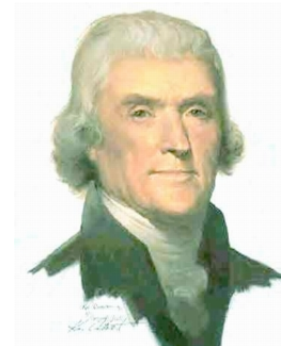
- New titles added to the OLL now come with downloadable MARC records so librarians can add the text to their own online catalogs in order to make them more accessible to their patrons.
- OLL titles with MARC records are part of a collection at WorldCat known as "The Online Library of Liberty".

POWERFUL SEARCH ENGINE

- Search all books in the library, all works in a given subject area, all the works by a particular author, all the works in a collection, or just one book!
- Search filters allow you to limit searches by historical period, school of thought, nationality of the author, subject area, or topic.
- Search results show the full paragraph in which the search term is located.

PORTABLE LIBRARY OF LIBERTY DVD

- a 5th edition of the PLL contains 1,002 titles in EBook PDF format drawn from the OLL and is available free of charge upon request.

CREATE YOUR OWN READING LISTS

- teachers & professors can now create their own customized reading lists for their classes using the resources of the OLL.
- sign on & begin browsing the OLL website to select entire books or chapters to add to your list.
- when you are finished making your selections you can edit your list giving it a title, adding explanatory information about your course, adding links to your own institution's websites, changing the order of the readings, & so on.
- when your reading list is finished you assign it to a subject area (e.g. "History") & a suitable audience (e.g. "College Undergraduate"). If it is appropriate we will publish it on the OLL so your students can access it via the WWW.
- browse our current reading lists for inspiration. See what other teachers are doing & how they are using the OLL to facilitate teaching & learning in the humanities.
- print your reading list as an anthology of readings which can be made available to your students.

ECONOMICS CONTENT

Liberty Fund sponsors 2 websites which have economic content:

- Topics: spontaneous order, money & banking, popular political economy, the critique of socialism
